Texas Hold'Em

\$2 - \$4 Limit

Small blind is \$1

Big blind is \$2

There are 3 legal raises in the game so the capped bet is \$8 pre and post flop. Now, after the flop, on the Turn (4th card) and the River (5th card), the bet is \$4 with 3 legal raises equaling \$16 for both streets.

\$2 - \$2 - \$4 - \$4

Texas Hold'Em & Limit Hi Omaha

\$1 - \$3 Limit (Triple 5)

Small blind is \$1

Big blind is \$3

There are 3 legal raises in the game so the capped bet is \$12 pre flop. Now, after the flop, on the Turn (4th card) and the River (5th card), the bet is \$5 with 3 legal raises equaling \$20 for all three streets.

\$3 - \$5 - \$5 - \$5

Seven Card Stud

\$1 - \$3 - \$5

Seven-card stud - the player deals the first two cards face down and one card face up. The player with the smallest card showing must put in \$1 minimum. The smallest showing card has a forced bet he doesn't even have the option to fold in a seven-card stud game.

Now the small card puts in \$1, the next player who wants to play has the option to call the \$1 or what is called "complete the bet" or raise to make the bet \$3. If he or any other player completes the bet, then the bet has to be matched by anyone who wants to continue the game.

The next card "4th street" - the player with the best showing hand has the option to check or bet \$3. The only variation in this is if he has a pair on the "4th street", example 22 showing, he is allowed to go straight to a \$5 bet verse a \$3 bet. He can make it \$3 but he and only he has the option.

Now for the 5th, 6th, and 7th street the bet is \$5. This game has a three raise maximum. Seventh card is dealt face down.
